## TODAY

Today we welcome **Jane Woods** Director of Development for the LeRoy Haynes Center in LaVerne. The Center provides specialized treatment and educational services to children with special needs relating to emotional development, autism, Asperger's Disorder, learning disabilities, neglect and abandonment. The Center was founded in 1946 by LeRoy Haynes, a former chaplain at the Fred Nellis Youth Authority, in Whittier, as a way to help many of the troubled boys he served, through intervention and treatment in a home-like setting.

The group home facility has grown from its initial ten residents to six cottages each housing twelve children. Mental health treatment services are provided to every resident. The entire facility serves 350 to 400 children annually through its three basic programs – residential, Haynes Education Center, and mental health.

Jane Woods began her career at LeRoy Haynes Center in January 2008 as a grant writer. She was promoted to Corporate and Foundation Relations Officer in November 2009 and became the Director of Development for the agency in January 2011.

She formerly provided grant writing and development consulting services to the California Legislative Black

Caucus Foundation, Paint Your Heart Out – Anaheim, Urban Education Partnership and Golden State Minority Foundation.
