## This Week:

Human trafficking is a growing problem that takes advantage of the young and vulnerable. Would you believe that the average age of entry into prostitution is 12 to 14. Something needs to be done and in San Bernardino, something is being done. Karen Bell, chief deputy district attorney of San Bernardino County District Attorney is in charge of the county Coalition Against Sexual Exploration or CASE. CASE was formed to work with law enforcement, prosecutors, service providers, and the public on how to intervene, educate, prevent and suppress human trafficking.

Case uses a two-pronged effort to arrest, imprison, fine, and seize questionable assets from those who prey on minors, and at the same time provide support to those minors through juvenile placement facilities, residential facilities placement, and other social services as well as providing training and education.

Chief Bell has been a county employee for 35 years but not always as a prosecutor for the District Attorney's Office. Before receiving her law degree, she worked as a group supervisor in Juvenile Hall and later as a probation officer.


## Last Week:
