Special message from Harry Borak: The *Los Angeles Times* ran a story on 01-14-16 entitled: *Suicide Bomber Targets Pakistan Polio Center* on page A3. It outlined a terrorist attack that killed at least 14 people, thirteen of them being police officers who were guarding the site of a polio vaccination clinic. That clinic, near the border of Afghanistan, was scheduled to remain open for three days and it was part of a drive to reach 2.4 million children. It should be noted that there were reported to be 306 new cases of polio in Pakistan in 2014 and only 52 cases in 2015.



Although Harry is saddened by the news and cannot fathom why someone try to stop the vaccination process, he remains optimistic that polio will soon be eradicated.
