California Citizens Legislature Initiative



John Cox, 61, was born and raised in the south side of Chicago. His mother was an educator; his stepfather a lifelong postal worker.

From these modest beginnings, John developed a successful career as an attorney and CPA. He founded an investment advisory firm, a real estate management company, and a venture capital firm. These firms manage and own assets in excess of \$200 million.

In the 1990's, John led an investment group that purchased Jays Foods, a major regional food manufacturer, saving over 600 local jobs. He recruited and led a team of managers who turned a \$17 million loss into a \$3 million profit in less than a year.

John is a longtime Republican activist, serving as president of the Cook County Republican Party. He was an original Club for Growth member with Larry Kudlow and Steve Forbes. He is actively involved in charitable work, having founded an affiliate of Rebuilding Together and serving on the board of USO San Diego.
